#### How to Use This User Guide

This Study Island User Guide is written for you, the student, and for your parents and teachers, who help you get the most out of Study Island.

Parents: Use this guide at home to help your student use Study Island and to monitor your student's progress.

Teachers: Use this guide to familiarize yourself with the Study Island student interface and direct your students to tutorials in this guide.

Here are a couple tips to help you use this guide:

- The topics most relevant to get you started using Study Island come first, including signing into your account, how to earn Blue Ribbons, how to practice topics, and finding your assignments.
- Remember to ask your teacher or parent if you ever need help using Study Island. Or look up the topic in this user guide.
- For topics or tips that parents and teachers will find important, you'll see boxes like these:

Parent & Teacher Tip: These tips help parents and teachers understand features in the student interface, offer applicable suggestions for assisting students, or provide pointers for motivating students while they are practicing in Study Island.


## What Is Study Island?

Study Island is a K-12 online practice and assessment tool. In other words, it helps reinforce what you've learned in the classroom and practice for tests in a fun and motivating way.

#### Important Reminders

We know you are excited to start using and exploring Study Island. Here are a few things to remember before you start your learning adventure:

- Always ask your teacher or parent for permission before signing on to Study Island.
- Study Island works great on most kinds of electronic devices, including computers, tablets, and smart phones.
- You need to have an internet connection to use Study Island.




# Sign Into Your Study Island Account

To sign into your Study Island account, you need your username and password. Your teacher will give you your username and password the first time you use Study Island. Your username and password are unique to you. Keep them secret and safe.

If you forget your username or password, your teacher can help you.

- 1. Go to <a href="https://app.studyisland.com/cfw/login/">https://app.studyisland.com/cfw/login/</a>. Bookmark this page so you can easily find it each time you log in.
- 2. Type in your username and password, and click Sign In.







# Easy Login for Kindergarteners and First Graders

Your school's Study Island Account Administrator may set up an easy login for students in kindergarten and first grade. Each class using Easy Login will receive a Group Username and Group Password.


Parent & Teacher Tip: Follow these instructions to help your kindergarten or first grade students sign into their Study Island account using Easy Login.

- Go to the <u>Study Island Sign In</u> page and login using the <u>Group</u> <u>Username</u> and <u>Group Password</u>.
- 2. Select the first letter of your first name.






3. Select your name from the list.




4. Enter your unique password and click **Continue**.





#### Your Home Page

Your Home page is the first page you see when you log into Study Island. The first time you log in, the tiles might be blank. As you complete practice sessions and assignments, you will start to earn Blue Ribbons, which will appear on your Home page.







## How Do I Change My Student Experience?

If enabled by the Study Island Account Administrator at your school, you can choose a different background for your account. The animated background with Taco the Crab is the default.

Follow these instructions to change your background:



- 1. From your Home page, click My Profile.
- 2. Scroll down the page and select the background you want. Only the classic animated experience includes Taco the Crab cheering you on during practice sessions.
- 3. Click Save.







#### How Do I Earn Blue Ribbons?



Every time you master a topic, you earn a Blue Ribbon. Mastering a topic means you met the passing goal. The default passing goal is 70%, but your teacher may set a different passing goal. Every Blue Ribbon you earn is displayed on your Home page. You can also run a Blue Ribbon Report on the My Reports page.

Follow these instructions to find the Passing Goal for a topic:



- 1. Select a Program from the Menu.
- 2. Select a program and subject.
- 3. Click a topic from the topic tree.

On the Practice Modal, the Passing Goal can be found here:



Parent & Teacher Tip: Motivate students by having them set goals of how many Blue Ribbons they want to earn each week. Teachers: set a goal as a class and create a bulletin board to show your class their progress toward the Blue Ribbon goal.



#### How Do I Practice a Topic from a Program?


The content in Study Island is organized into programs and then into subjects. For example, your program may be Minnesota Academic Standard Mastery for Fourth Grade. Within that program are the following subjects: Math, ELA, Science, Social Studies, and Common Core Math. Ask your teacher which program and subject you should work on.

Follow these steps to find a topic for a specific program and subject.


1. Click on Programs. You may have to choose between your state Program or US Program. Ask your teacher which one you should use if you are not sure.



2. Choose the subject you want to practice. Your Program should automatically be selected.



3. Choose a topic to work on.




Parent & Teacher Tip: The topic tree shows which topics students have earned Blue Ribbons for, any in-progress topics, and what standard the topic aligns to.




### How Do I Keep Track of How Many Topics I've Completed?


You can easily track how many topics you've completed on each subject page. There is a gold ribbon on each subject page that fills up a little more for each topic you complete.




When you've completed all the topics in a subject, you can print off a certificate! Click View Certificate below the gold ribbon.



Choose one of four options to print. Ask your teacher for permission to print the certificate. Your name will appear in the space "Your Name Here" when you print.







# How Do I Find My Assignments?


Your assignments are right on your homepage when you sign in.

Parent & Teacher Tip: The My Classes page is where students will access teacher-created classes. If the teacher has not created a specific class in Study Island, this page will be blank. Classes are not required for students to practice topics in Study Island. See <a href="How Do I Practice a Topic?">How Do I Practice a Topic?</a> to learn how to practice in Study Island from a program.

Follow these steps to find and work on your Assignments:




- 1. Click My Classes.
- 2. Click **View Assignments** on a class tile. You may have one or more classes. You can check your assignments for each class separately on this page.





All of your assignments in that class show up:



- 3. Start or continue an assignment by clicking one of the arrows. An orange arrow means you can continue a saved, in-progress session. A green arrow means you can start a new session.
- 4. View the results of a completed assignment by clicking the magnifying glass.




### How do I join a Group Session?

Group Sessions are a fun, competitive game to show what you've learned. Your teacher leads the session, and you compete with your classmates. There are 3 types of Group Sessions: Checkpoint, Challenge, and Race. These steps will show you how to join a session when your teacher tells you it's time to join.

- 1. In the Menu, click My Classes.
- 2. Find the right class, or ask your teacher which class. Click **View Assignments** for the right class.



3. Under Group Sessions, find the session your teacher wants you to join and click Start.



4. Now you'll be able to choose a random nickname. Next, your teacher will start the session. Have fun, and try your best!



#### How Do I Take a Benchmark Test?

A Benchmark test gives schools a snapshot of how students are doing at a certain time during the school year. Schools may assign Study Island Benchmark tests up to four times per year. If it is time for you to take a Benchmark test, the test will show up on your Study Island Home page. Benchmark tests are made available during a testing window. Within that window, students can begin a test, save it, and return to it later. If they do not turn in the test before the end of the testing window, the tests will automatically be turned in and graded.

Teacher Tip: If you do not currently have benchmarks provisioned in your Study Island account, contact Study Island Support for more information about this additional feature.

1. Click the green **Start** arrow to begin the test.



- 2. Answer each question and click **Next Question**.
- 3. Click **Tools** to access to access buttons that let you increase font size and highlight text.



4. Click **Save for Later** if you need to work on the test later.




5. When you have completed the test, click **Turn in Test**.






# How Do I View My Grades from a Completed Test?

You can view the results from a test immediately after completing it. Your results page will look similar to this one:



If your test contained constructed responses (questions that you had to type in your own answer, like an essay question), your teacher will need to grade these questions. Follow these instructions to check your test results:

- 1. Sign into your account.
- 2. Under the main menu, click **My Classes**.



- 3. Click **View Assignments** for the class the test was for.
- 4. Click **View** on a completed test to open the results page.


You will find the status of your test (graded), any comments from your teacher, and your score on this page.





### How Do I Complete a Practice Session?

A **Practice Session** is any time you practice answering questions about a topic in Study Island. When you click on a topic or start an Assignment, the Practice Modal appears.




You can practice a topic in different modes:

#### Lesson

Review the topic before you take a practice session.

#### **Practice**






Practice a topic by answering questions.

- 1. Click Practice.
- 2. Answer each question and click **Submit**. This will show you if your answer was correct. The wrong answer will have a red X next to it. The correct answer will have a gold star next to it.
- 3. Click **Explanation** to learn more about the answer.
- 4. Click **Next Question** to continue to the session.
- 5. Click **Tools** to display the Tools ribbon. You can increase or decrease font size, highlight text, or comment on a question.
- Click Save Session to save your current session. You can return to it later to continue working on the same session.



#### Game Mode





Practice a topic and play a short game for every correct answer.

- 1. Click Game Mode.
- 2. Select the type of game you want to play: Puzzle Games, Action Games, or Sports Games.
- 3. Click a game to view a preview.
- 4. Click **Play!** to begin the practice session.

If you answer a question correctly, you will have the option to **Play Game** or go to the **Next Question**.

#### Flash Cards






Use flash cards to review the topic.

- 1. Choose the number of flash cards you want to practice.
- Select Interactive Flash Cards to practice on your device. To print them, select Printable Flash Cards.
- 3. Click **Flip** to see the answer.
- 4. Click **Next** to go to the next card.
- 5. Click **Back** to return to the Flash Card Options page.



#### **Printable Worksheets**



Print the practice questions so you can work on the topic without a device. This is a great option if you don't have access to a computer or the internet at home.

- 1. Click Printable Worksheets.
- 2. Select the number of questions to print.
- 3. Select Print.
- 4. Follow your computer's prompts to print your document.



#### How Do I Save a Practice Session?

If you do not have enough time to finish a Practice Session, you can save the session. If you have started a 10-question session, but haven't yet completed all 10 questions, you will have the option to save your work. Then you can continue the session at another time.

1. When you are in a session, click **Save Session**.




2. Click **OK** on the popup window.



Your session is now saved.

3. Click Continue Session to return to your session, or click Return to go back to the topic tree.






#### How Do I Return to a Saved Practice Session?

It's easy to return to a saved Practice Session. A saved session is also called an **In-Progress Topic**. Your saved sessions appear on your Home page under **In-Progress Topics**.

- 1. Sign in to Study Island.
- 2. On your Home page, look at the **In-Progress Topics** tile to find a list of your current saved



sessions.

3. Click the orange arrow to continue the saved session.



### How Do I Find My Game High Scores?

Parent & Teacher Tip: In Game Mode, correct answers are rewarded with a short game. This feature can be turned on and off by the Study Island Account Administrator or by teachers. Contact your student's teacher with any questions about this feature.

1. Click on My Reports.



2. On the **My High Scores** tile, choose one of the options to see your high scores.



### How Do I Check a Message from My Teacher?

Parent & Teacher Tip: Teachers can message a whole class, a select group from a class, or an individual student. Students can only message their teacher(s). Students cannot message other students using Study Island.

Your teacher can send messages in Study Island. Here's how you check your messages.

1. Click the orange **Message** button in the top right corner of your homepage. Your **Message** button may have a number next to it, which shows how many new messages you have.




2. On the **Message Center**, click anywhere on a message bar to view the message.





- 3. To delete a message, select the message. Then click the red **Delete** button.
- 4. To reply to a message, type your reply into the box and click **Send**.





## How Do I Message My Teacher?


If the student messaging feature is enabled, you can send messages to your teacher if you have a question or to ask for help. You will need to know your teacher's Study Island username to send them a message.

1. On the Home page, click the orange **Message Center** button in the top right corner of the screen.





- 2. Click Compose Message.
- 3. Type in your teacher's username and a subject for the message.
- 4. Type your message and click **Send**.





### How Do I View Reports?

You have access to several reports that show your progress in Study Island. Use these reports to check your own progress or update your parents on how you are doing.



- 1. Go to My Reports.
- 2. For the report you want to view, select the Program and Subject from the drop-down menus.
- 3. Click **View Report** to view in a new browser window.

Some reports have a **Download PDF** option to view the report in a separate PDF document.





# What Does Each Report Show Me?

Individual Subject Report	Shows the following items for a specific subject:
	<ul> <li>The number of completed sessions for each topic</li> <li>Time spent on each topic</li> <li>The best score achieved for each topic</li> <li>Number of questions correct out of total questions attempted</li> <li>Cumulative score (Your average score based on all the sessions completed for that topic)</li> <li>If a topic is mastered</li> </ul>
Individual Summary Report	Shows Session Details and Cumulative Scoring for each subject within a program
Suggested Topics Report	Suggests topics for you to work based on your performance
Statewide Comparison Report	Compares your progress to the state averages by subject
Individual Blue Ribbon Report	Shows the number of Blue Ribbons earned out of the total number obtainable
My High Scores	Shows your high scores in games played while in Game Mode
